Classroom Focus: Erdkinder

Interview with Ms. Z - by Alayna Faiz Mrs. Z is the head teacher of the Erdkinder class and has been working at MANH for 17 years. The Erdkinder program is very unique compared to other public high schools. Every child is treated as an individual and most classes are grouped by abilities rather than grade level. According to Mrs. Z, the older students act as role-models for the younger students who can then learn and follow in their footsteps. Field experiences also play an integral role in the program. Students travel to places like Mexico, where they attend a Spanish school for six hours a day, or Florida, where they learn science and history. The Erdkinder program not only focuses on academics but also on moral character and development through the practice of virtues including patience, honesty, cleanliness, respect, and much more. Additionally, the program equips students with practical skills, like learning to run a business through the monthly cafe, to prepare them for adult life.







A Day in the Life - by Samantha Adams Erdkinder students start off their day at 8:15 with line. Subsequently, they begin their morning classes which are divided into two blocks: the math-spanish block and the ELA block. The first block goes from 8:30 to 10:05, and the second from 10:15 to 11:45. Following the morning classes, the students go outside for recess before returning for lunch. They then do their community jobs before preparing for afternoon classes which consist of history, EME, STEAM, and science, though on Friday the schedule is altered to have music, art, and theater.

Morning Line - by Kyle Riffner Every morning, Erdkinder begins the day with a 5-10 minute classroom line (meeting). Biweekly, four students are assigned roles for line, including facilitator, greeter, planner leader, and observer as, unlike Primary or Elementary line, the students lead the meeting. The facilitator is responsible for beginning and ending line as well as dictating the meeting's structure. After the leader rings the bell and everyone has said good morning to each other, the greeter is instructed to share an uplifting quote with the class before the general schedule for the week is shared by the planner leader. Then, the facilitator shifts the topic to announcements and open discussion. Following this segment, the floor is opened for acknowledgements during which students affirm their peers for their virtuous behavior. Finally, the observer states the mood of the group and points out a few students who kept their attention focused on the speaker, spoke up clearly for everyone to hear, added appropriate humor, etc. By 8:30, everyone is dismissed to their first class of the day.
