Fascinating Work at Freeman West



Material Focus - Peg board


The peg board is one of the many math materials in the Vuzzano Class. The board and its many holes and colored pegs allows students to better understand topics such as square roots and learning to find the gcf and lcm. The colored pegs represent different values: red ones represent hundreds, blues represent tenths, and greens represent the units. By, for example, organizing the beads in a perfect square (according to a given problem), adding wings, and a second perfect square accordingly (as shown in the picture below), students are able to visualize certain, more abstract math concepts with ease.



Vuzzano Students Favorite Material

The Vuzzano class was recently surveyed for the favorite Montessori material within the class. A short list of works was prepared and the students were surveyed regarding their preferences. The majority answered pin and or puzzle maps which are maps that the students label or trace. These materials allow them to explore geography and learn more about the world's many sites.

Ms. Vu and Mr. Azzano are both lead elementary teachers in the East Campus. Ms. Vu has been working at MANH for 5 years and Mr. Azzano is nearly finished with his 7th year. The two teachers split the group of students between themselves; Mr. Azzano primarily teaches the lower elementary students (1st-3rd) while Ms. Vu teaches the upper students (4th-6th). The Vuzzano classroom demonstrates community in many ways through cooperation, unity, and peacefulness. Whether that be by setting up for lunch, cleaning around the classroom, or leading a group meeting, each student helps bring the clas together. More specifically, in the case of conflicts, students are encouraged to settle the situation themselves. If they struggle to do so, they then can seek the advice of an older student. Only after the previous methods are unsuccessful are students encouraged to approach the teachers.
