




#### **AMI Conference**

# Dr. Naghibzadeh's Retirement

## Interview with Dr. N (RERUN) - by Kyle Riffner

Dr. Molood Naghibzadeh has created several traditions since founding MANH in 1989 including International Day, a day of dancing and food from around the world. She established the annual event out of a desire for unity within MANH's diverse student body. Because December is most closely associated with the celebration of Christmas, many who didn't celebrate the holiday felt a bit disconnected. Inspiration struck and Dr. N. decided to create a day which celebrated everyone not despite their differences but because of them. Year after year, she watched as her vision blossomed and grew. While the dance performances were the main event, Dr. N. also had a lot of appreciation for the handmade food (specifically those from Japan, Korea, India, Pakistan, and Iran); over the years, she noted that these aspects from outside cultures became a part of her as she was eventually able to recognize them without even reading the label.

Teamwork encompassed the event as a whole. Teachers and parents worked together to both plan the event and organize nearly all aspects of the performances. In some cases, parents even sewed dresses and accessories for the students. Even after the food was eaten and the festivities came to a close, the collaboration among the community members continued in the form of cleanup. Dr. N. proudly mentioned that in thirty minutes, with the help of parents, children, and grandparents alike, the place would appear spotless.

The regularity of MANH's International Day strengthened the community for several reasons including the fact that alumni could attend each year to reunite with their friends and former teachers with their own appreciation for the work that goes into the performances on stage. This year, our first International Day since the pandemic was held in the spring. Regardless of the changed date, the excitement around the celebration has persisted.

She along with a team of four friends and family helped to transform the storefront into a beautifully furnished Montessori classroom equipped with the classic materials and shelves. Following her from her former Montessori school to MANH (or as it was previously known: MSNH), several parents identified with her vision and joined Dr. N in this endeavor, and class was in session with a grand total of five students. MANH's story is truly a testament to the birth of a difference-making dream. Through constant love, passion, and effort, a hopeful idea and 1200 square feet, became a cohesive school community consisting of over 200 students and staff across three beautiful campuses.
