Her work showcases themes of displacement and instability inspired by her own experience fleeing two wars. However, she communicates these ideas through mysticism and alchemy to create work that is uniquely her own: constellations, potions, witches, and masked figures in otherworldly settings. The experience was both intriguing and inspiring! Capitalizing on the timing of the trip, Mr. Frolick took the class to the seasonal creche which showcases handmade terracotta figurines arranged theatrically in an 18th century Naples-inspired setting. As part of their US Government class, the upper Erdkinder students got an opportunity to visit the modern art exhibit which Mr. Frolick used as an avenue to discuss how art and the Government overlap both thematically and

monetarily.

Huntington Happenings




